Start here

This kit covers all 50 words on the grade 2 list. You do not need to print the whole thing — most families print the study pages and the flashcards, and come back for the worksheets later.



1. Print what you need

Study pages and worksheets print fine on any home printer. For flashcards, use the heaviest paper your printer accepts and set double-sided printing to flip on the long edge — the backs are already laid out to line up that way.



2. Practice out loud, every time

Say the word, spell it aloud letter by letter, then say it again. Spelling out loud catches mistakes that silent reading hides.



3. Use the sentence

A word learned inside a sentence sticks far better than a word learned alone. Every word in this kit has one.



4. Sort into two piles

After each round, split the flashcards into words they got right and words they missed. Practice only the missed pile next time. This is the single biggest time-saver in the kit.



5. Track it

The progress tracker near the back has a box per word for three separate days. A word is learned when it is spelled correctly on three different days — not three times in one sitting.

Having to do with something.

“We read a book about sharks.”

TIP Starts with a lonely a, then the word out: a + bout.

apple · AP-ul

Easy

ap·ple · noun

A round fruit that is red, green, or yellow.

“I packed an apple in my lunch.”

TIP Double p in the middle, then -le at the end, like little and purple.

animal · AN-uh-mul

Medium

an·i·mal · noun

A living thing that can move on its own.

“The fox is my favorite animal in the book.”

TIP Three parts, and each one has one vowel: an-i-mal.

basket · BAS-kut

Medium

bas·ket · noun

A container woven from strips of material.

“We filled the basket with apples.”

TIP Split it in two and each half is easy: bas + ket.

another · uh-NUHTH-er

Challenging

an·oth·er · adjective

One more of the same kind.

“May I have another slice of orange?”

TIP It is an + other pushed together. One word, not two.
