Start here

This kit covers all 50 words on the grade 4 list. You do not need to print the whole thing — most families print the study pages and the flashcards, and come back for the worksheets later.



1. Print what you need

Study pages and worksheets print fine on any home printer. For flashcards, use the heaviest paper your printer accepts and set double-sided printing to flip on the long edge — the backs are already laid out to line up that way.



2. Practice out loud, every time

Say the word, spell it aloud letter by letter, then say it again. Spelling out loud catches mistakes that silent reading hides.



3. Use the sentence

A word learned inside a sentence sticks far better than a word learned alone. Every word in this kit has one.



4. Sort into two piles

After each round, split the flashcards into words they got right and words they missed. Practice only the missed pile next time. This is the single biggest time-saver in the kit.



5. Track it

The progress tracker near the back has a box per word for three separate days. A word is learned when it is spelled correctly on three different days — not three times in one sitting.

ancient · AYN-shunt

an·cient · adjective

Very old, from a time long ago.

"The museum displayed an ancient clay pot."

Easy

TIP The 'shunt' ending is spelled -cient. The c does the sh work.

breeze · BREEZ

breeze · noun

A light, gentle wind.

"A cool breeze came off the lake."

Easy

TIP Double e in the middle, and a silent e at the end: br-EE-z-E.

accident · AK-sih-dunt

ac·ci·dent · noun

Something bad that happens without anyone planning it.

"The spill was an accident, not carelessness."

Medium

TIP Double c doing two jobs: the first says k, the second says s.

blossom · BLOS-um

blos·som · noun

A flower on a tree or plant.

"Every blossom fell from the tree after the storm."

Medium

TIP Double s in the middle, and it ends in -om, not -um.

amateur · AM-uh-chur

am·a·teur · noun

Someone who does something for fun rather than for money.

"As an amateur photographer, he shoots only on weekends."

Challenging

TIP The ending is -eur, which comes from French. Memorize it as a chunk.
