This kit covers all 50 words on the grade 6 list. You do not need to print the whole thing — most families print the study pages and the flashcards, and come back for the worksheets later.



1. Print what you need

Study pages and worksheets print fine on any home printer. For flashcards, use the heaviest paper your printer accepts and set double-sided printing to flip on the long edge — the backs are already laid out to line up that way.



2. Practice out loud, every time

Say the word, spell it aloud letter by letter, then say it again. Spelling out loud catches mistakes that silent reading hides.



3. Use the sentence

A word learned inside a sentence sticks far better than a word learned alone. Every word in this kit has one.



4. Sort into two piles

After each round, split the flashcards into words they got right and words they missed. Practice only the missed pile next time. This is the single biggest time-saver in the kit.



5. Track it

The progress tracker near the back has a box per word for three separate days. A word is learned when it is spelled correctly on three different days — not three times in one sitting.

abrupt · uh-BRUPT

Easy

a·brupt · adjective

Sudden and unexpected.

“The music came to an abrupt stop.”

TIP One b, one p, one t. The word rupt (meaning break) is inside it.

blizzard · BLIZ-erd

Easy

bliz·zard · noun

A severe snowstorm with strong wind.

“The blizzard closed every road in the county.”

TIP Double z in the middle, and it ends in -ard, not -erd.

adequate · AD-ih-kwut

Medium

ad·e·quate · adjective

Enough for what is needed.

“One blanket was not adequate for that cold night.”

TIP Q brings a u, and the ending is -ate: ad-e-qu-ate.

boundary · BOUN-duh-ree

Medium

bound·a·ry · noun

A line that marks where something ends.

“The fence marks the boundary of the property.”

TIP The word bound is at the front, then -ary, not -ery.

apparent · uh-PAIR-unt

Challenging

ap·par·ent · adjective

Easy to see or understand.

“It soon became apparent that we had taken a wrong turn.”

TIP Double p, single r, and it ends in -ent. The word parent is inside.
